


- Arnold showed us his newest side wheeler and how he hoped he could speed up the craft (in case we have another paddle wheel event!).




#### Arizona Update:

My port stuffing tubes & props have arrived from England so I can start adding the propulsion to the lower hull anytime now. In the meantime I've been keeping busy by building all the small features that go on later. It's a more painstakingly slower process than I imagined. I have to paint each one as it is built. I realized I couldn't just paint the whole model after it's done. It wouldn't look right and might also ruin the wooden decks I purchased for it at no small expense. Generally I do most of my painting on the weekends, I prefer natural light as opposed to fluorescent. Usually the sun has set by the time I'm ready to work on my projects during the week.



#### Enterprise Update:

Construction phase has been hold until the equipment arrived for the Arizona, so I could complete both at the same time. To keep busy I've been working on painting the most important feature of a carrier, her flight deck. This is the first thing everyone will notice so I wanted it to be accurate. It will take some time to paint it all. However, once the hull is finished and the deck installed, she will be pretty much done. Not like there is much other details, besides planes. I have decided to only build a few planes for the deck. I know several models I've seen have all the squadrons on the deck. First off, I probably don't have the patience to build & paint 30-40 little planes. Second, they would just be dust collectors. At least with an empty deck, one quick wipe and its clean.

#### The Briante Model Swamp Buggy Challenge

#### Purpose:

- A purely fun event to engage the creativity and skills that exist among VMSS members.
- Build a model swamp buggy (airboat) to compete in two separate timed events.

**The Challenge:** Accumulate the maximum number of points based on two timed events and one "Got the Look" category.

Prize(s): Top three.

Date of Challenge: June 13, 2015 following General Meeting at Harrison's Pond.

Entry Deadline: Group order will be placed shortly following the March 12, 2015 general meeting.

Entry Fee: \$30

Other Costs: See details below including order form

#### **Required Component:**

- All participants are required to use a HobbyKing (TR2213/20) motor shown below
- The entry package will include two high quality propellers as a starter. The supplied propeller can be substituted with any other type of propeller.







#### **Power Source:**

 Voltage is restricted to 12 VDC using a battery technology of your choice. Any capacity lipo battery can be used but cannot exceed 3s

#### **Rules:**

- (1) Each entry can be single or team.
- (2) Each individual or team will be supplied with one out runner motor for propulsion and optional propellers.
- (3) ESCs: Any type may be used. See recommended size if you don't have one
- (4) Hull size: No restriction

- (5) Hull shape: No restriction
- (6) Operating Voltage: Lipo 3s maximum for propulsion or any other battery type with voltage not exceeding 12 VDC.
- (7) Motors: No substitution permitted
- (8) Propellers: No restriction on size or shape. Two propellers will be supplied just to get started
- (9) **Steering:** Your choice but you cannot use a rudder in contact with water.

#### Design considerations:

- Participants use the "same motor whose maximum output wattage is limited by the use of 12 VDC voltage source". So, no individual/team has any advantage.
- Fastest times will more than likely be posted by participants with "clever hull" design and skills in RC control.

#### Point System:

- Individual Run: Two back and forth runs that include one or two loops. Batteries should be able to last a minimum of 5 minutes.
  - 100 points for first, 90 for second, ... 60 for fifth. Remaining 50 points.
- Mass Start: Same course as above.
  - The top three in the Individual Run and in order of finish, select a starting position. The remainder scrambles for positions.
  - During this run anything goes to create an advantage.
  - Points awarded as in individual run.
- Got the Look Category ( could be the tie breaker):
  - At the General Meeting of June, 2015 competitors enter the building first with their models hidden from view and display them on front table. The non competing club member that enters the building next will not know the owners of the models.
  - Three non competing members, one at the time, are chosen by draw. The first draw removes a model from the table and awards it 20 point. This is repeated for second and third draw.

#### New Lipo Batteries:

- In addition to entry fee you will need an out runner speed controller, lipo battery and lipo battery charger which you can add to the order form
- These additional components will have lots of other RC boat uses.

#### Orders:

- All parts will be purchased from Hobbyking International with one order to reduce cost.
- Shipping will be express . Prices shown in the chart below reflect shipping cost, dollar exchange rate (≈20%), Visa/Master currency exchange charge (2.5 to 3%), and a small additional charge for incidentals (supplies needed to set up race course).
- Different capacity batteries can be used with the outrunner motor. The 1300 mha batteries at full power will last for 8 minutes and at race pace the time is more like 15 to 20 minutes. Both legs of the race should not take more than 5 minutes.
- Consider using a Zippy 2200 mah lipo which will deliver 15 min at full power.
- Note
  - nano-tech & zippy are high quality lipos.
  - The motor and batteries used for this challenge were selected to have other RC boating uses. So it's not one time use and then discard!
