








Steve Martin's HMCS Ontario, pictured above with his HMCS Kitchener, won the Public Choice Award

### The 150 Program

Next year, 2017, is the "Sesquicentennial" of our country. The what?? Simply, Canada's 150th Birthday. The federal government is intending to promote it nation-wide, as the first big celebration of Canada since 1967. Any and all ideas, big

or small are invited to share in the festivities.

My idea is for us as a club to celebrate Canadian marine heritage. Full size cars, trucks, airplanes, even locomotives, can be preserved for posterity. But it is enormously expensive, and often difficult, to preserve ships. On this coast we only have the tugs "Swell", "Master" and "Ivanhoe", the Arctic exploration ship "St Roch", and the "Canadian Princess", formerly the Hydro graphic Survey Ship "W.J. Stewart".

But the essence of our hobby---or it used to be---is replicating any and all full-size ships as models., preferably radio-controlled to operate them in their native element.

My proposal is to have models, IN ANY SCALE, of **Canadian flagged** ships, either built in this country or overseas, floating along the south shore of Harrison Pond. If we have enough (wonderful!) they would be moored pointing outwards. If not, they would moor end to end. A P.A. system would allow us to introduce each model to spectators lounging or standing on the sloping northern shore.


Some members may not own such a model. That is why I'm proposing the idea right now. The show date hasn't been set but will likely be in July 2017. This allows members who want to join in enough time to build a new vessel. As for plans, I have a sizeable collection, and the club's own collection includes the famous "S.S. Beaver"!

So after I make this presentation (which was backed by the Executive) on Thursday night, I'll offer three different plan sets for anyone wanting to start right away.

I have contacted the "150" Office in Ottawa and a woman named Sarah replied very favourably to this idea. I haven't heard of any other club trying this Program. But I hope we can invite Nanaimo and Mainland clubs to join us.

This will be the biggest public display by the VMSS since EXPO 86.

I hope many of you will catch " the Spirit of 2017"!"
