





## Ingenuity, trimmers power model boats

A North Saanich business uses motors from weed whackers in its remote-controlled racers

Combine a hobby with a necessity, add a pinch of innovation and voila, Dorrien Thompson is in business ready to make waves on a lake near Port Alberni next week.

Thompson and his team from Bandit Boats in North Saanich will be racing six remote-controlled boats powered by a weed-trimmer engine against 150 of

the best in Canada and the U.S. in the Canadian championships July 25-27 on Great Central Lake

It will not

Dorrien Thompson Bandit Boats only be fun for the team as they try to top the world record 117 kiloour for the

metres per hour for the one-quarter-scale boats, but it will help put Thompson's 21-month-old Bandit business on the map.


"Racing boats is a growing market in the U.S.," Thompson said in an interview.

"After that there is the Australian and German markets. The Canadian market is small. I'd say 99.9 per cent of our boats go to the U.S."

His company, with himself and two part-time staff, turns out 200 remote-controlled boats a year.

The basic boat has a reinforced platsic hull and costs \$195-\$350 US.

Throw in another \$850 to \$1,500

for a motor and radio and you are boats up to 32 km/h. With a little bit racing.

boats up to 32 km/h. With a little bit of modification he is up to nearly 65

That will have you clicking through the lake at around 60 km/h, but after the hobbiest modifies the engine it can hit 88 km/h.

Thompson said the average boat racer is 45 years old and will spend \$3,000 a year on his hobby.

Thompson takes the engine from a grass trimmer, which he buys off the shelf. He can get the metre-long boats up to 32 km/h. With a little bit of modification he is up to nearly 65 km/h, and a really singing modification can get it up to the world record of 117 km/h.

That engine will set one back \$425 US, or double the grass-trimmer engine cost.

However, the cost of running is better. Fifteen minutes of gasoline on the grass-trimmer engine is about \$2.50, but the cost of nitro to run the other engine for the same time is

Thompson now has orders for six of his boats and engines from the Bahamas.

He said there are about 300 racers in Canada and five on Vancouver Island

Anyone going to the Port Alberni races can pop into the tourist information office for a map of the best viewing locations on the lake.






