NAUTICAL TRIVIA

ABOVE BOARD - above the decks, open and visible. Today, we use this old term to denote fair play.

BRACE OF SHAKES - indicated how fast the sails filled when "coming about". "I'll be with you in a shake" is a derivative of that term.

BIBLE - a seaman's name for a holystone because they used it in a kneeling position.

GALLEY PEPPER - soot and ashes. In the early days of coalfired ships and poor crew accommodations, the soot and ashes would fall into the food while it was being prepared and eaten.

MONKEY PUMP - a seaman's name for a straw or quill inserted through the gimlet hole in a cask of wine, allowing him to drain off some of the contents.

SQUARE MEAL - before the nineteenth century seamen were often required to supply their own eating utensils. A plate was often carved from a piece of plank. Today we use the term to denote that one has enjoyed a good meal.
