 \mathbf{F} lagship of the 'S.A.L.T.S.' fleet is the "Robertson II" one of the last Canadian fishing schooners built. She was launched in 1940 in Shelburne, Nova Scotia, and represents a valuable link with Canada's maritime past. Massively constructed of pine and oak she originally worked the Grand Banks with 20 men and eight dories. In 1974 she set sail for Victoria to start life again as a sail training vessel for young people. Over the past few years she has been extensively re-fitted and restored to her historic rig.

EXTRACTS FROM THE LOG OF THE SHIP "FELICITY"

ROBERT OAKAPPLE - MASTER

- June 3, 1820 Going down to the vessel for launching at 10:30 am. Met a woman with empty pail and passed Rev. Adam Noble. Launching unsuccessful. Ways broke down. Fear hull has been strained.
- June 16 Hull jacked up, ways repaired. Builder reports no damage. Ship took water at 12:15 pm.
- June 30 Great difficulty in securing crew to take vessel around to london.
- July 12 Mate reports seaman brought one of those
 **'furry' things on board. Ordered it's
 neck wrung and body thrown overboard.
 Temperature 70 Wind steady S E Fair.

Appendix: **rabbit on a ship was considered very bad luck and was referred to as a 'furry' thing. Pigs, women and ministers were also unlucky omens. The second-named object of this trio-a woman- was only an object of ill omen if she carried an empty pail, or crossed the mariner's path.
