



THE HISTORY OF THE TEST TANK

To-day, the Test Tank is part and parcel in the designing of hulls, but in 1871 it was a new technique. The first ship builder to see the potential in tank testing was William Denning, in Torquay.

The tank's function was to test previously built models, by testing and refining the shape to improve their speed and seaworthiness.

Another innovation was to build an over-sized scale model hull of a new design. The hull would have a coating of paraffin wax which would gradually be scraped off until the maximum safe speed was achieved.

The famous'Cutty Sark; and the first turbine passenger ship, the 'King Edward' were early products of the Test Tank.
