I gather from some of the feedback I have been receifing, that some of you are dissatisfied with the way things were done as regards the new pond. Perhaps a word of explanation will help clear the air. When Fred Haire and I were notified that the Juan de Fuca parks board were to begin excavating for a new clubhouse, we were asked if thw VMSS wanted the clay fill. If we did, we would have to take it immediateky as the board was to begin excavating the next day. offered to give us this XXXX fill for nothing and offered to truck it to the pond site also at no charge. As this clay was what was needed to build up the dam or berm (ordinary dirt will not work as it will leak) we jumped at the offer. There was no time to call a meeting of the club to accept or reject this offer so we took it upon ourselves as representatives of the club to accept the fill as and when delivered. to purchase this amount of fill we would have had to pay almost \$3000.00 for it. The next step was to obtain a machine to position this fill as we could not just leave it in a pile so this is what we did. And that's why the pond is there today. To those of you who are not happywith this explanation, I ask you what you would have done if the shoe were onthe other foot? Sure it cost us money, but isn't that what that money was collected for i.e. a model boat pond ? To those of you who feel they must resign over this issue, I ask you to reconsider and pitch in with the rest of us to develop what could be the best thing to happen to the club. If you are still unhappy, remember elections are held every November. Why don't YOU run next time around!



Now that most of the V.M.S.S. sailors have opted for the E.C. 12 as our club boat, this has given me the opportunity to write and create a few articiles on our vessel and the building of her.

She originated as a towing-tank testing model at Treasure Tooling, Tampa, Fl., before the 1967 America's Cup Race. The hull is a copy of the full-size yacht, COLUMBIA, with alterations by Charles Morgan, vessel designer. In the late 60s., James "Buddy" Black of Tampa gained possession of the Columbia towing- tank model. He then used the model as a plug for a fiberglass mold.

Our V.M.S.S. member ROB WOODWARD is doing this with the Puritan E.C. 12 hull we as a group purchased during March of this year. In time he'll be producing hulls for the club members who are interested in


sailing this model.


Following the American Model Yachting Ass. E.C.-12 Metre one design Class specifications, experimentation and experience have produced a fast, yet graceful, model sailboat. The E.C. 12-M model sailboat is the only A.M.Y.A. class boat based on the full size 12M. yacht. Our E.C. 12M. comes from a long line of 12 metre design and racing.

RUSS HAYDEN is making the mold for the deck which will be used on our E.C. 12 M. When ROB has finished making the mold he'll produce a hull and assemble the deck to the hull. Once the hull, deck and rudder are complete and assembled to his satisfaction the model will be taken to BOB STERNE in Vancouver for certification with the Canadian Radio Yachting Ass. This is to insure that our E.C. 12 will match up with others produced by other builders and be accepted for competition eslewere.

Once the first hull has passed certification ROB can start producing hulls and I believe that JACK PLUMMER is hull #2. Good Luck all E.C.12 M. Builders.




