

1st - ask fellow club members...someone is bound to know

- -get company or manufacturer name and address
- -to get any addresses not previously found, contact the Public Library Reference desk.

Also at the Library, there are two company register directories:

- 1-Dunn & Bradstreet, is the Canadian directory
- 2-Standerd & Poores, is the International directory
- -contact a museum or news in the area the original was/is from.

The information will start coming in in a few weeks.

The Mechanical Drafting Department at Camosun College may be able to help you with your model plans. I wanted my model plans scaled up and someone suggested one of the trade schools. A contact was made at Camosun College Drafting Department. I explained what I had in mind and asked if they might be able to accommodate. What I wanted was to enlarge my plans from 1/8 inch per foot to 3/8 inch per foot. The chief instructor agreed and over the summer a student worked with the C.A.D. computer program (Computer Aided Design) to increase the size of the prints. I am pleased with the results and the school indicated they would be willing to help with other plans. Displacement: 5800 tons light and 8500 tons full load

Dimensions: length 149-0m (488.9 ft); beams 23-0m (75.4 ft); draught 5-4m (17.7ft) normal and 8.7m (28.5 ft) flooded down

Gun Armament: two 120mm (4.7 in) mortars and four 40mm Bofors AA Missile/Torpedo/Anti-Submarine Armament: none

Aircraft: the main helicopter platform can accommodate three Aérospatiale SA 321 Super Frelon or 10 SA 318 Alouette III helicopters while the portable platform aft can accommodate one Super Frelon or three Alouette III's.

Capacity: the well deck measures 120-0m (393.7ft) in length and 14.0m (45.9ft) in width and can accommodate 2 EDIC landing craft tanks (each loaded with 11 tanks) or 18 loaded LCM(6)s for the direct assault role in which case troop accommodation is 343; in logistics role a freight load of 1500 tons can be carried. Typical loads are one 400 ton ship, or 12 50-ton


